














Dear Parishioners:

Annual Financial Report Fiscal Year ended June 30, 2022

Dear Parishioners,

The fiscal year ended June 30, 2022, was very successful for both the Church and the School. Our Parish community's response to requests for increased Sunday collections, special gifts, the ADA and the STEM capital campaign all are examples of the renewed commitment to the stewardship and support for our Parish!

For the Church, after our November stewardship appeal for increased Sunday giving, we saw a rise in Sunday collections which has continued through the remainder of the fiscal year. For the year ended June 30, 2022, total income for the Church was \$1,997,000 compared to a budgeted total income of \$1,813,000. The higher income reflects an increase in Sunday Collections, compared to budget, of \$64,000 and gifts and fundraising were \$106,000 above budget primarily related to the start of PLG fundraising activities which had been suspended during COVID. In addition, the Parish received an ADA rebate of \$26,000. Expenses for the year were \$217,000 above budget reflecting the start again of PLG activities and major cosmetic upgrades to the Rectory (painting, room refreshment, etc.). In summary, the operating surplus for the Church for the year was \$57,000. This is the first time since 2016 that we have had an operating surplus two years in a row! In addition, due to very favorable returns in the pension plan investment assets held at the Diocesan level, there was a \$190,000 decrease in the unfunded pension liability for the Church. Our final net surplus including this adjustment was \$247,000.

For the year ended June 30, 2022, the St. Simon Parish School (School) finished with net income from operations of \$669,000 versus budgeted net income of \$353,000. As reported in the financial tables below, the difference is related to many items, both the revenue and expense side, with no single item being the major cause of the increased surplus from operations. However, there was significant activity below the operating line, with a (\$368,000) unrealized loss on The Teacher Endowment Fund, income of \$1,180,00 related to the STEM building project fundraising, a favorable unfunded pension liability adjustment of \$1,479,000 and the recording of reimbursements for COVID related expenses under state programs of \$468,000. For the STEM building construction, approximately \$1,600,000 has been raised and combined with an allocation of \$500,000 from a prior year bequest, we have reached our goal of approximately \$2,100,000.

The Teacher Endowment Fund (TEF) recorded a net decrease for the year ended June 30, 2022 from unrealized investment losses, earned interest and donations of \$367,000 less TEF expenses for teacher funding and other expenses of \$547,000. As of June 30, 2022, the restricted assets of the TEF were \$1,704,000.

For this 2022/2023 fiscal year, student enrollment is 478 for K though 8th grade, compared to 473 in the previous year, and Preschool enrollment is 49 compared to 54 in the previous year. We welcome this new school year with strong enrollment which is a reflection of the school's reputation – named a "National Blue Ribbon School" in September 2021.

Our balance sheet remains solid primarily due to fundraising, gifts and special bequests. The facilities are maintained to the proper level. For the period, July 1, 2018, to June 30, 2022, \$2,136,000 has been spent on the Parish campus to refresh the classrooms, new roofs, parking lot repair, new safety requirements, rectory upgrades, Preschool addition and design work for the STEM lab. But having noted the solid balance sheet, a good portion of our cash (\$7,271,000 of our \$7,692,000 of cash) is restricted to certain programs, endowments or donor designated funds. Thus, the need each year to break even from operations and carefully manage our cash and expenses continues.

We believe in transparency in the financial operations of St. Simon Church and School. Complete financial statements are available for your review in the parish office. 

Sharing our Gifts with Others

Each year the people of St. Simon Catholic Parish share their gifts with others outside our parish. In addition to regular Sunday offerings, we answered God's call to help those in need with financial support to various organizations. For 2021-2022 our outreach to others totaled **\$490,924**. Of these gifts, \$380,800 are not included in the Parish's financial Report since the donations are made directly to the outside organizations.



In addition to this financial support, the St. Simon community was generous in their response to various other needs throughout the year.

- We supported St. Vincent de Paul Society with school supplies, sleeping bags, warm clothing, Easter basket supplies, and gift certificates for Thanksgiving and Christmas outreach giving, and food for local poor.
- We participated in the Tijuana Ministry and helped to build homes for two families in need.
- We prepared and served over 2700 lunches to the local homeless through our Homeless Meal Ministry.
- We volunteered each week to support the Catholic Charities food box drive-thru hand out.
- We assisted with the reopening of Casa de Clara ,the Catholic Workers shelter for women and children in San Jose by painting, gardening, and providing new furnishings for two of the bedrooms.
- We Supported the School backpack drive for Catholic Charities and made monthly food donations for SVDP.

STEM Multipurpose Classroom Project. Two years ago we began the feasibility and design phase for a STEM Multipurpose classroom for St. Simon Parish School. During this last year we began a two pronged fundraising effort: To raise \$1.9 million for our classroom construction, and raise an additional \$200,000 as a donation from the St. Simon community to St. Patrick Catholic School in downtown San Jose to help them develop their STEM offering for their students. We were successful in raising \$2.1 mil and broke ground in May, 2022. Our project is nearing completion with the Open House and Ribbon Cutting set for November 13, 2022. Building on our partnership with St. Patrick School, a check in the amount of \$200,000 was presented to St. Patrick School administrators at our School Mass on October 19, 2022.

Ministry Updates



During this last year we have focused on enhancing Liturgy and Prayer through music with the intent that we inspire parishioners to serve as musicians and cantors and share their talents with the parish community. The over arching purpose is to inspire artists to use their musical gifts for the Glory of God.



Resonding to regular, on-going feedback about wanting a band to return to the 5:00 PM Sunday Mass, we have hired John Kellet (First picture) as our Band Leader with the intention of making the 5:00 PM music more contemporary and inspiring for youth, especially high schoolers. John has been successful inrecruiting members to the Band.



For the last year John Angotti has served as our Master Musician, bringing his many years of experience composing and performing music, presenting workshops and retreats, and sharing his experience as the Director of Liturgy at his home parish in Tennessee. John spends a week a month with us interacting with our current Liturgical musicians and offering one-on-one voice coaching. He promotes music at St. Simon School with fun concerts designed to get the children to understand the joy of singing, with an eye on engaging them to sing at Mass. He is also working with middle schoolers to form a Jr. High Choir. John has directed and performed at our very successful concerts pulling in various musical groups from inside and outside our parish



Following the retreat presented by Fr. Brendan, "From Here to Eternity" on the the topic of death and dying we have uncovered the need to engage a Grief Support Ministry here at St. Simon.. Plans are in motion now to begin this new ministry in November.



Our Hope and Wellness Ministry, started last year, is working to a multi year plan to create awareness and help remove the stigma around mental health. They have put on awareness walks, offered workshops, have discussion groups and have offered training around issues of mental health.
