

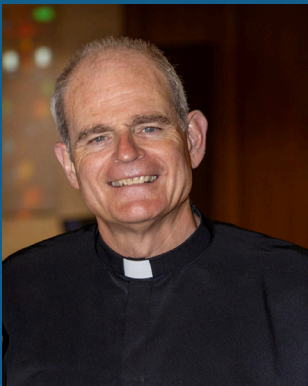

Our Community's Growing Needs

For years, St. Simon has stretched every inch of its campus to serve a thriving parish and school. We have reached the point where our facilities can no longer sustain the academic excellence, ministries, and formation programs our community deserves. The strain is felt everywhere.

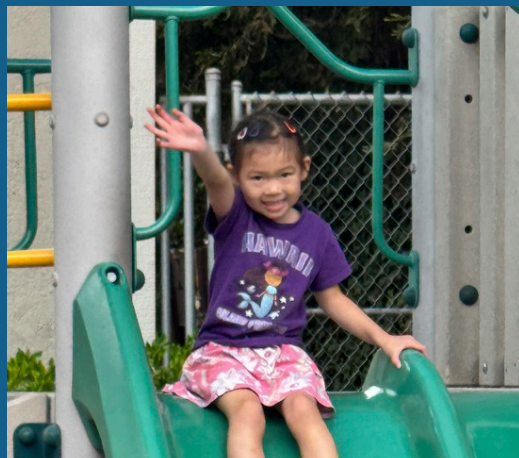
School elective classes such as Spanish meet in Spooner Hall (primarily a lunchroom and event meeting space) and the Simon Room (a parish meeting space that is also used for after-school extended care). Middle School Math classes, serving all 210 students in grades 6–8, sometimes struggle to find space. The number of students we can serve with resource support is currently limited due to a shortage of available space.

Our spiritual life faces the same constraints. Ministry meetings compete daily for spaces tied up by school classes. Small faith sharing groups, spiritual exercises and outreach groups lack dedicated rooms for meeting, prayer, discussion and fellowship.

Parish retreats of 300 people lack room for breakout sessions and extended formation. Our Sunday Faith Formation is scattered across campus — parents in the art room, children in classrooms, Order of Christian Initiation (OCIA) meetings in the rectory. Our outreach programs want to grow but have nowhere to organize.

We have parish staff currently scattered across campus and working out of the rectory, and some school staff without dedicated offices/workspaces.

The need is clear. The moment is now.





A Purpose-Built Home for Learning

The Education & Spirituality Center will be a 12,000 sq. ft. (approx.), mission-driven facility designed around the real needs of our parish and school — shaped by years of listening, planning, and discernment. It will provide our community with the dedicated spaces needed to learn, pray, and grow.

The Center will include:

- **School classrooms** — bringing Spanish, math, and other programs into real learning environments, relieving overcrowding for our students and teachers
- **Ministry and collaboration spaces** — a true home for our 40+ ministries, outreach programs, and pastoral staff to meet, plan, and serve
- **Spiritual direction rooms** — supporting Spiritual Exercises in Everyday Living (SEEL), prayer, discernment, and one-on-one support for parishioners on their faith journey, which can also be used for resource learning and counseling spaces for students during the school day
- **Retreat and formation rooms** — for parish missions, OCIA meetings, ministry trainings, and small-group prayer, giving our growing faith community room to gather
- **Parish offices** — uniting our team in one building and restoring the rectory as a proper private residence for our clergy and ministerial guests

This is the campus our mission deserves. This is the space our community needs.

The Community Gathering Plaza and ADA Ramp are fully funded. Our Little Saints Preschool Expansion has been partially funded and is underway with generous support already committed.

A welcoming outdoor space connecting our Church and Parish Center. Extends hospitality around school events, Mass, and parish ministries. Creates additional outdoor space for outdoor learning and parish gatherings.

ADA Ramp to Schram Field

Ensuring our campus is safe and accessible for everyone.



Little Saints Preschool Expansion

New building with classroom, reception area, and office. Improves safety with new crosswalk and parking. Strengthens our Catholic education pathway and space for Sunday faith formation classes.

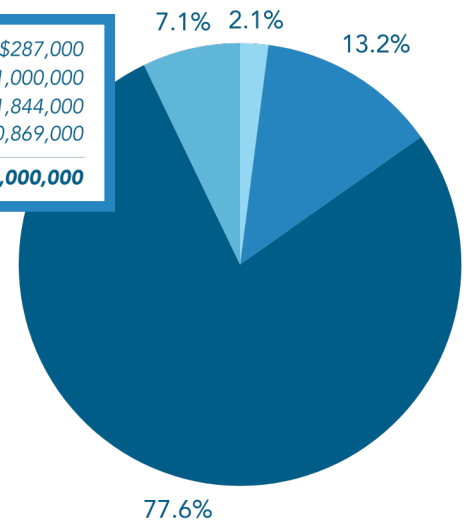
